Joseph Campbell (March 26, 1904 – October 30, 1987) was an American mythologist, writer and lecturer, best known for his work in comparative mythology and comparative religion. Bill Moyers (June 5, 1934 -) is an American journalist and public commentator. He served as White House Press Secretary in President Lyndon B. Johnson's administration from 1965-1967. He worked as a news commentator on television for ten years. Moyers had an extensive involvement with public television, producing documentaries and news journal programs. These video clips present parts of conversations between Moyers and Campbell that examine the nature of religion and its possible origins.
