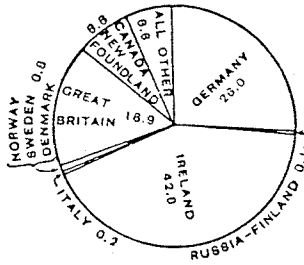
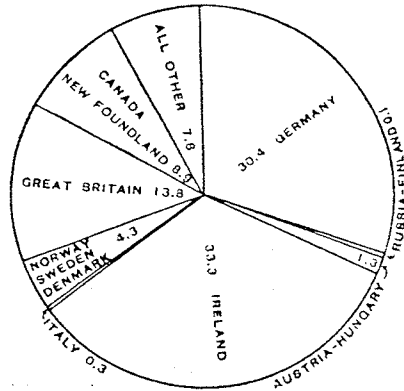

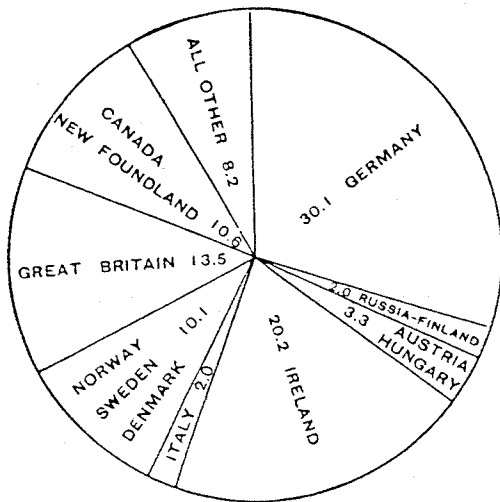
TOTAL FOREIGN BORN, 1850: 2,244,602



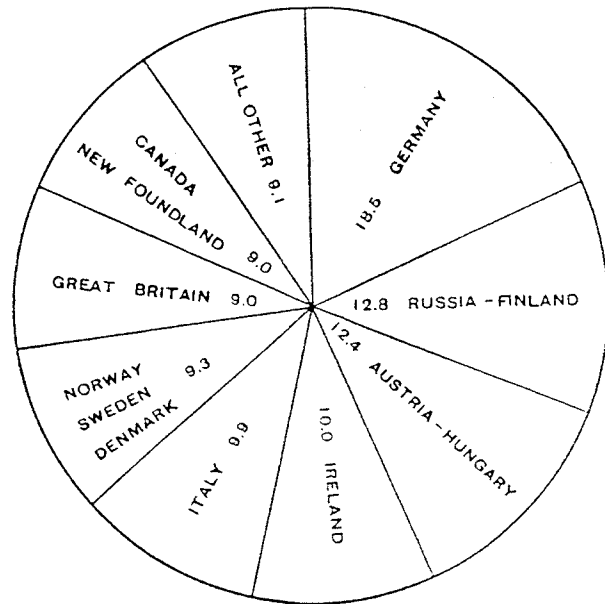
TOTAL FOREIGN BORN, 1870: 5,567,229



TOTAL FOREIGN BORN, 1890: 9,249,560

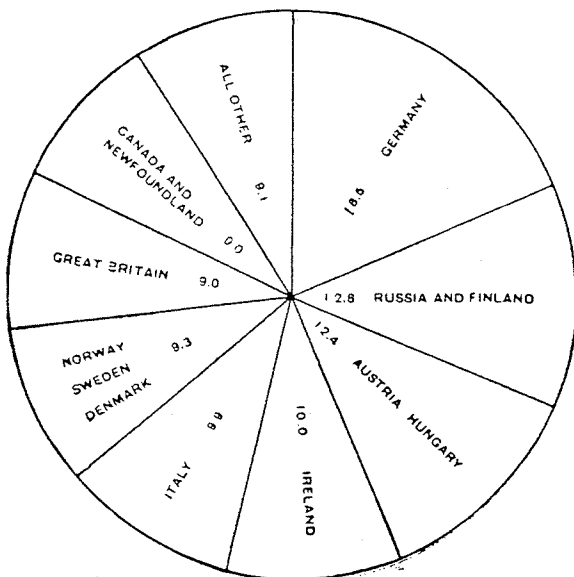

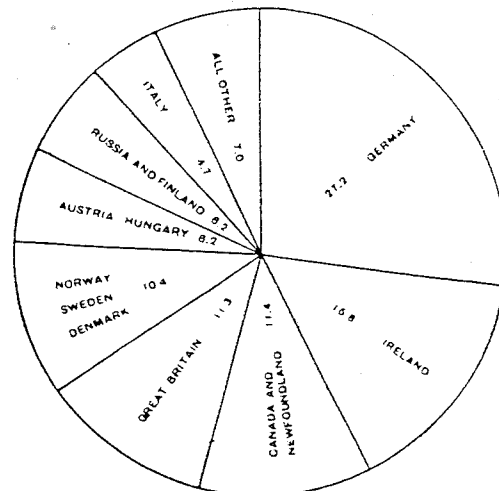
