- The petition drive deadline for ballot initiative efforts seeking ballot access in 2012 in Colorado is August 6, 2012.
- The state signature requirement for both initiated constitutional amendments and initiated state statutes is 85,853.
- The 2012 state legislative session began on January 11, 2012 and ended on May 9, 2012. Legislative referrals could have been sent to the 2012 ballot during this time.

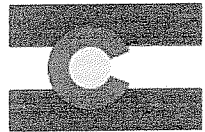
