

Arabia in Mohammed's time


- Various tribal religions
- Jewish communities
- Christian communities, usually splinter sects

Mohammed

- Born about 570 in Mecca
- About 610, claims to receive visions and messages.
- These collected and written down about 650 as the Koran.
- Flees to Medina, 622 (Hijrah)
- Return to Mecca, 630
- Unified Arabia by the time of his death in 632

The Pillars of Islam

- 1. Creed (shahadah)
- 2. Five daily prayers (salaht)
- 3. Alms (zakaht)
- 4. Fasting during Ramadan (sawm)
- 5. Pilgrimage to Mecca (Hajj) [Haji denotes one who has made the Hajj]
- Some authorities add a sixth pillar:
 6. "Jihad" is defense of Islam and active opposition to evil and injustice.



Sources of Islamic Doctrine

- Qur'an (from root meaning read or study)
- Hadith (tradition): traditional sayings of Mohammed and other early followers

Study and explanation of the Qur'an
Sharia (way): Codified Islamic Law

The Qur'an: Allah's Last Word

- About as long as the New Testament
- 114 surahs, arranged from longest to shortest
- Most surahs are collections of Mohammed's teachings with no overall theme
- Surahs are labeled by distinctive or unusual words found in each
- No historical chapters
- Considered the definitive form of Arabic
- Strictly speaking, cannot be translated, only paraphrased

Qur'an

- Praise to Allah
- Predestination
- Eschatology



A Bit About Arabic

- Semitic Language based on three-letter roots
- Example: s-l-m connotes wisdom, harmony
 - Salaam, peace
 - Suleiman (Solomon)
 - Islam (submission to divine will)
 - Muslim (one who submits to divine will)

Schism about 700 A.D.


• Reasons:

- Succession to Caliphate (Caliph, successor; successor of Mohammed)
- Incorporation of non-Qur'anic elements into Islam
- Worldliness of Caliphs, discrimination against non-Arab Muslims
- Shiites (*shia*: party or faction) about 10% (mostly Iran)
 - Fundamentalist
 - Sunnis (Sunna: beaten path) about 90%


Dynasties

- Orthodox Caliphs (632-661)
 - abu-Bakr (632)
 - Umar (634)
 - Uthman (644)
 - Ali (murdered in 661)
- Umayyad Dynasty (661-750)
 - Damascus (Syria)
- Abbasid Dynasty (750-1258)
 - Baghdad (Iraq)
- Ottoman Empire (1299-1922)
 - Istanbul

Sufi Islam

- Sufi (woolen)
 - Refers to the coarse, woolen garments worn by early Sufis
 - Poverty and rejection of earthly pleasures
 - Mysticism and emotionalism
 - Fakir or Dervish (convert to Sufiism)


Effects of Islam

- Preserve classical learning
- Innovations in astronomy and mathematics
- Link between East and West
- "Arabic" numbers from India
- Trigonometry also from India
- Sanctuary for Judaism

The Spanish Connection

- Wadi-al-yahara (Valley of Flowing Water) → Guadalajara
- Al-ghattas (type of sea bird) →Alcatraz (pelican)
- Al-amir-al-bahr (lord of the sea) → Almirante
 →Admiral
- Jebel Tariq (Tariq's mountain) →Gibraltar
- Much "Spanish" architecture is actually Arabic
