	What were some significant shifts (changes) in the document that relate to the author's purpose?
Subject	What are the general topics and ideas contained in the text?
Tone	What is the attitude or emotional characteristics present in the piece?
	Give specific words/phrases as examples of this tone or attitude.
	Analyze how the tone (choice of words, emotions, imagery) reveals the author's attitude toward the subject.
	Analyze how different aspects of the text reinforce the tone. (Cite specific examples from the document & analyze how those words support/strength the tone.)
