### What is government?

- People and institutions charged with establishing, carrying out, and interpreting laws and public policy
  - Family parents (with input from children?)
  - School administration (with input from teachers, students, parents)
  - Town mayor and council (with input from citizens)

## What were the origins of government?

- Collective needs: food, clothing, shelter
- Collective protection: from crime, outside attacks, natural disasters

 Economies of scale: by working collectively, societies reduce cost and increase effectiveness

# Why do people submit to governments?

- Force Theory: a person or group uses physical force to control a population
- Evolutionary Theory: a family group grew and expanded to a clan, then tribe, and with the development of agriculture (tie to land) the state emerged
- Divine Right Theory: God created the state and gave royals "divine right" to rule
- Social Contract theory: members agree to give power to the state in return for protection of rights and wellbeing

### Why do governments fail?

- Abuse of power: individuals and groups controlling government use power for their own ends
- Weakness: individuals and groups controlling government are unable to protect the people's rights and/or well-being
- Power struggle: individuals, groups, and/or the people fundamentally disagree about the best ways to protect the people's rights and/or well-being
